In situ trips: ARCHAEOLOGICAL AND AGRICULTURAL TRIPS:

✓ B: Analysis of case studies on the Uzbek territory- SAMARKAND

- a) Archaeological site and museum of Afrasiab/ancient Samarkand + National Archaeological museum = 4h
- b) Samarkand Institute of Archaeology, visit to the museum and to the institute, including laboratory for chemical analysis and restoration, etc. = 4h
- c) The Uzbek rangeland, ancient human settlements and abandoned irrigation canals + typical herding + modern farms of intensive horticulture = 4h
- d) Archaeological site of Kafir Kala (approx. 30 min from Samarkand) = 2h, + village with traditional horticulture and architecture = 4h
- e) May 1st Dam, a Soviet hydraulic work that feeds irrigation canals of the whole region, with the local museum and the close archaeological site. The way to the dam crosses the district of Taylak, one of the most important agricultural area of Samarkand with vineyards and wineries.
- f) Visit to farms/factories in the Samarkand territory to explore agricultural solutions adopted in the Uzbekistan territory (to be scheduled with the Samarkand colleagues)
